

Family-Based Alternative Sentencing Program Funding Available FY2022

Greetings from the Family-Based Justice Center.

Thank you for subscribing to the Family-Based Justice Center listserv. We are looking forward to launching our website soon. In the meantime, we would like to inform you of the available funding from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) for Family-Based Alternative Sentencing pilot programs. The deadline to submit applications is **June 21, 2022**.

OJJDP is looking to fund states and communities as they implement new, or enhance existing, community-based alternative sentencing programs that provide culturally competent, community-based supports to strengthen the emotional, physical, and social well-being for children and families. OJJDP will support potential models that divert justice-involved parents/primary caregivers from the prison system, promote the unification of families, and prevent children from entering the foster care and/or juvenile justice systems

Anticipated maximum dollar amount of each award is \$750,000 and the anticipated number of awards is six.

Eligibility has been extended to:

- City or township governments
- County governments
- For-profit organizations other than small businesses
- Native American tribal governments (federally recognized)
- Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized tribal governments)
- Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education
- Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education
- Private institutions of higher education
- Public and state-controlled institutions of higher education
- Small businesses
- Special-district governments
- State governments
